CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Dear Residents

The Christmas lights switch on will be on **Sunday 26 November 2023 at 6pm** and will coincide with the end of the Snowman Festival. Frosty the Snowman will be there and I hope you will be able to come along as well. There isn't a lot of space, so please gather on the land itself or on Station Road. Please walk to the event if you can, as there is very little room for car parking and we don't want anyone to park on Spendmore Lane or gather on that side of the site, as it is a very busy road. Children **MUST** be accompanied by a responsible adult.

The Parish Council is undertaking a five year management plan and would like your input as to what you would like to see included. Funding for projects will come from the Community Infrastructure Levy, which is a levy imposed on developers by the Planning Authority. The Parish Council receive 15% of this funding at the present time. The new Village Hall was previously proposed when the last amount of funding was received and this is now near completion. New funding is expected in the next financial year. This plan is separate from the Coppull Neighbourhood Development Plan which is in the process of being produced, led by residents with the backing of the Parish Council. Once the NDP is completed, the Parish Council will receive 25% CIL funding. **So please let us know your views!**

I would like to thank members of the Parish Council, the Lengthsmen (Tony, Sven and Chris), gardener, George and the Clerk for all their hard work over the year. Also, all the people who help put up the Christmas lights, without these volunteers, the display would not be possible.

Volunteers are always welcome! All members of the Parish Council are, in effect, volunteers, as they do not get paid. They do their best to help out with whatever needs doing in the village, but many of them work and also have family commitments. If you would like to help in any way, please get in touch with the Clerk.

Please let us know if there are any other events you would like to see in the village. At the moment we have the Picnic in the Park, Remembrance Day, Christmas lights and, this year, the Snowman Festival organised by Mary Russell. The Parish Council would like to put on other events in the year, but again would need the volunteers to help.

As 2023 draws to a close, I would just like to wish all residents a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. I hope the new year is prosperous for you all.



REMEMBERING BARRY MASON

Barry Mason was born in Wigan on 12 July 1935 and he grew up in Coppull. His father, Cecil, died when he was nine and he had a younger brother and two step-sisters when his mother remarried. He was one of the world's leading songwriters and wrote the bulk of his hits in partnership with Les Reed. His many gold records include all time favourites, Delilah, Love Grows (Where my Rosemary Goes), The Last Waltz, Here It Comes Again, Les Bicyclettes De Belaize, Love is All and There Goes My First Love.



His songs have been performed by Tom Jones, Elvis Presley, David Essex, Engelbert Humperdinck, The Drifters, Rod Stewart, Barbara Streisand, The Fortunes, Des O'Connor, Petula Clark, The Dave Clark Five, Cleo Laine and many others.

REMEMBER DELILAH was his one-man show in which he sang his songs and sold the stories behind his million sellers, with anecdotes about the starts of the sixties and seventies and what it was like to be there and survive! Lyricist Sir Tim Rice encouraged people to go and see this show.

Barry received five IVOR NOVELLO awards (The Oscars of British music) and nine American BMI and ASCAP awards. His musicals inclue American Heroes, Miranda and One Last Summer. He was a long serving council member of The British Academy of Composers and Songwriters. He regularly initiated workshops for fledgling songwriters.

Barry was in much demand around the world as a guest speaker on the art of



the popular song writing and as an after dinner speaker at private and corporate functions.

Barry Mason had two daughters, Aimi and Maggie and a son, Tyler. He was appointed Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) in the 2020 Birthday Honours for services to music. He died on16 April 2021 aged 85 and was survived by his sisters Lynn and Diane and long-term partner Vanessa Martin.

CHORLEY COUNCIL AND COPPULL PARISH COUNCIL YOUTH ACTIVITY FUND 2022/23

The Parish Council received £1,000 from Chorley Council to be distributed out to approved groups to encourage and support local clubs and groups to provide new activities for the youth of the village. This funding came from Chorley Council's Neighbourhood Priorities for 2022/23.

Six groups applied and were asked to provide certain information. However, one group did not meet the criteria, but it was agreed that the following groups receive £250 each:

- Coppull United Football Club under 16's
- Wrestling Federation events for children/families in the village
- Springfield Leisure Centre summer holiday activities for children
- A1 Fitness group activities for parents and children
- Coppull Junior Bowls received funding through the Lancashire County Council Councillor's Fund



At Lancashire County Council we do everything we can to keep traffic moving on priority roads and we are open about the fact we cannot grit every road in Lancashire. Even if we had the resources needed, we couldn't grit them quickly enough to make a real difference. No council does this. It is important people understand that there are limitations to the service we can provide. That is why we ask residents to take steps to make sure that when severe winter weather strikes they are prepared and able to manage.

What we do:

- The County Council is responsible for over 4,300 miles of roads of which approximately 1,800 miles are part of Lancashire's 'Priority Road Network' for salting and snow clearing.
- It can take our gritters up to four hours to grit one route and even longer in servere
 weather conditions. This means sometimes we can't grit as often as we would like.
- When low temperatures are forecast we grit the roads as a precaution before the frost forms, usually during the evening or early hours of the morning. Remember weather forecasts are only a guide and our local knowledge and expertise is vital in deciding what to do.
- Despite our best efforts, winter weather can still make roads treacherous and there is no guarantee that roads will always be completely free of ice and snow. Take extra care.



CHORLEY AND DISTRICT MODEL RAILWAY CLUB





On Saturday 21 October, Chorley and District Model Railway Club set up their Big and Little Trains Show at Coppull Library. The show attracts people of all ages who are fascinated by the model trains, layouts and model buildings. There were several layouts on show to marvel at with working scale model trains. The model buildings are made from scratch and take many hours of work to create.

The Club often does shows at various venues and will return to Coppull Library again in 2024. The Club will also be involved in a project to recreate the now demolished Coppull train station as a scale model which will be displayed at the library when complete. This will be in conjunction with the Friends of Coppull Library's Oral History Project, which aims to record the stories of local residents about the history of Coppull. 
